

# PY 2020 Louisiana Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) State Plan

The mission of the Louisiana Housing Corporation is to ensure that every Louisiana resident is granted an opportunity to obtain safe, affordable, energy efficient housing.

The goal of the Louisiana Housing Corporation Weatherization Assistance Program is to reduce the national and state consumption of fossil fuels and imported oil and assist eligible low income families reduce their residential heating and cooling energy costs.

### Components of the PY 2020 LA WAP Program

- U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Grant EE0007923
  - The grant was extended for an additional year and runs July 1, 2017 June 30, 2021
  - Fourth Period Application: July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021 (currently the final year)
- Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Weatherization funding
  - Increased funding from 12% to 15% of FFY2020 Allocation

- Budget Points of Interest
  - PY2018 Total Completed Units 666.
  - Health & Safety is budgeted at \$1080 per unit for DOE funding and \$1200 per unit for LIHEAP funding.
  - Total number of Subgrantees decreased from 7 to 6.
  - Liability Insurance (DOE) is budgeted at \$1500 per Subgrantee. Liability Insurance (LIHEAP) is budgeted based on allocated actuals of existing Subgrantees.
  - Financial Audits (DOE) is budgeted at \$1000 per Subgrantee.
  - Incidental Repairs is budgeted at \$500 per unit. LIHEAP funding supplements any Incidental Repairs on DOE funded units.
  - Vehicles & Equipment is budgeted based on order of receipt of Subgrantee requests and the amount the statewide Average Cost Per Unit (ACPU) can support.

## **Eligibility and Monitoring**

- Program will use 200% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Additional waiting list points are given to the following groups:
  - Elderly (60 years of age and older),
  - Persons with disabilities
  - Households with children 17 years of age and under
  - High residential energy users
  - Households with a high energy burden.
- 6 Sub-grantees serving 64 parishes for weatherization assistance
- 2020 Average Cost Per Unit (ACPU): **\$7,669** (PY 2019 \$7,541)

• Section V.5.2, Comments Changed language from:

"LHC is currently in progress for re-approval of Louisiana's energy audit procedures using the Oak Ridge National Laboratory's Weatherization Assistant software for manufactured housing units, using Manufactured Home Energy Audit Version 8.9.0.5 (MHEA), and site-built, single family homes, using the National Energy Audit Tool Version 8.9.0.5 (NEAT). The current MHEA procedures were last approved by DOE on April 30, 2014 and will expire on April 30, 2019. LHC has also submitted for re-approval of the current NEAT procedures not scheduled to expire until September 8, 2021 to align the energy audit tools. Both are scheduled to be implemented with Program Year 2019." to

"LHC received conditional DOE approval of Louisiana's energy audit procedures using the Oak Ridge National Laboratory's Weatherization Assistant software for manufactured housing units, using Manufactured Home Energy Audit Version 8.9.0.5 (MHEA), and site-built, single family homes, using the National Energy Audit Tool Version 8.9.0.5 (NEAT). The first condition was the implementation of a standardized Energy Audit Checklist to verify initial field audit data collection and audit software data entry for every WAP job. This was implemented effective January 1, 2020. LHC is in the process of completing the second condition which is the development of an Audit and Inspection Process Manual. LHC's anticipated date for submission to DOE is May 31, 2020 for implementation with PY2020."
